Situation Report #6

1500 February 16, 2014

New information is in bold.

Summary: A winter storm brought over 20 inches of wet snow, sleet, and freezing rain throughout much of the Commonwealth. Governor McAuliffe declared a state of emergency on February 11; [Executive Order #7](#). Power outages during the event were minimal and were quickly restored. Hazardous driving conditions caused by the wintry precipitation continue to improve.

Snow showers developed rapidly during the morning hours of February 15 along the Interstate 81 corridor as a system crossed the Appalachians. Snow accumulations ranged from a trace to three inches across western areas of the Commonwealth with the higher amounts above 2500 feet.

- **Southwest & West Central Virginia**
Sunday: Mostly cloudy with a 20% chance of morning snow flurries with less than 1 inch accumulation across Southwest Virginia. High temperatures low to mid 40s, low temperatures low to mid 20s with winds 5-10 mph with gusts around 15 mph.
Monday: Mostly cloudy with a 50% chance of evening rain showers with rain/snow possible after midnight. High temperatures mid 40s to low 50s, low temperatures low to mid 30s with winds 5-10 mph. [NWS Morristown](#); [NWS Blacksburg](#)
- **Northwest & Northern Virginia**
Sunday: Mostly cloudy. High temperatures mid to upper 30s, low temperatures mid to upper teens with winds 5-10 mph.
