2010-01 January Snow Storm
30 January 2010 0900 hours

Summary: Governor Bob McDonnell declared a State of Emergency for the Commonwealth of Virginia on 28 January 2010 authorizing state agencies to assist local governments responding to the potential winter storm that is forecast to impact the Commonwealth Friday and Saturday, 29 and 30 January, with significant snowfall accumulations ranging from 4 to 14 inches. **The heaviest amounts, 12 to 14 inches, are expected in Southern VA along and north of VA/NC border to a line east along and south of I-64.**

Winter storm warnings are in effect for **ALL** areas of the Commonwealth with the exception of those localities for which a winter weather advisory has been issued: Shenandoah, Frederick, Warren, Clarke, Loudoun, Northern Fauquier, Prince William, Manassas, Manassas Park, Fairfax, Arlington, Falls Church and Alexandria.

Weather Conditions

Current conditions and snowfall estimates are:

- **Today**
 - **Southwest/West Central VA: (Blacksburg) Snow**, additional accumulation of 5 to 9 inches (total 8 to 14). High Temperature near 23.
 - **Central/Eastern VA: (Wakefield) Snow**, heavy at times with additional accumulation of 8 to 12 inches (total 8 to 14). High Temperature near 25.
 - **Northwest/Northern VA: (Sterling) Snow**, 6 to 10 inches expected in the Fredericksburg area with 3 to 7 inches in Northern Virginia and the Northern Shenandoah Valley. High Temperatures in the low 20's.
- **Tonight**
 - **Southwest/West Central VA**: Light snow likely before 1 AM. Possible accumulation of an additional 1 inch (total 8 to 14). Low around 12.
 - **Central/Eastern VA**: Snow, mainly before 2 AM with additional accumulation of less than an inch (total of 8 to 14). Low around 14.
 - **Northwest/Northern VA**: Low around 13. Possible additional accumulation of less than 1 inch.
