Consistent with the Emergency Restriction / Prohibition Order under Docket No. DOT-OST-2014-0067 (Emergency Order), issued by the United States Department of Transportation (US DOT) to petroleum crude oil railroad carriers on May 7, 2014, the following information is provided:

Earlier this afternoon, CSX Transportation derailed a petroleum crude oil train in Fayette County, WV. Norfolk Southern Railway Company (NSRC) will operate an estimated 2-5 detour trains for CSXT on a new route for trains transporting 1,000,000 gallons or more of Bakken crude oil traveling thru the towns of Bluefield, Walton, Roanoke, Lynchburg, Crewe, Petersburg, Suffolk, and Chesapeake, VA.

Updated state and county maps will not be sent at this time, as this is move is only being made due to the current emergency situation and will not be an on-going move.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

NSRC considers this information to be restricted information of a security sensitive nature, and further considers the information to be commercially sensitive. As such, the information provided herein is not subject to disclosure other than as allowed in the Emergency Order. Consistent with the Emergency Order and US DOT's Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) related to that Emergency Order, the information attached hereto should be used solely for and by bona fide emergency planning and response organizations for the express purpose of emergency and contingency planning.

This information is strictly intended for those persons with a need to know, that is, first responders at the state and local level, as well other appropriate emergency response planners. In the event you share any of the attached information with other emergency response agencies or organizations that have a need to know, you should require that such recipient likewise maintain this confidentiality.

NSRC has made reasonable efforts to verify the accuracy and completeness of the data contained in these files but makes no guarantees in that respect as should be understood by any and all users of this data that this is a static rendering of a fluid network that is subject to change based on constantly evolving business conditions.
