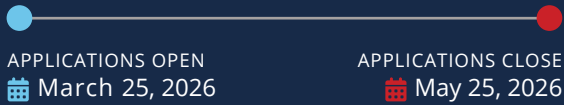




Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities Grant Program

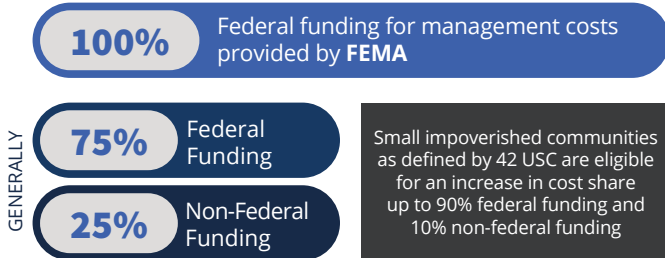
Cities, Counties, Towns, Planning Districts, State Agencies, Tribal Government



The Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) grant program makes federal funds available for hazard mitigation activities with the goal of lowering future disaster costs. It does so with a recognition of the need to upgrade and modernize the nation's infrastructure against natural weather disasters, and of the need for natural hazard risk mitigation activities and resilience with respect to those hazards. The Federal Emergency Management Agency will distribute up to \$1 billion for the BRIC program for the Fiscal Years 24 & 25. The BRIC program's priorities are to:

- Support projects ready for implementation and deliver immediate, measurable risk reduction to public infrastructure and communities vulnerable to natural hazards
- Prioritize new applicants, small impoverished communities, and broader geographic distribution of investments
- Target cost-effective public infrastructure protection, ensuring critical services can withstand or rapidly recover from disasters while addressing pressing hazard mitigation needs
- Incentivize the adoption and enforcement of the latest published editions of hazard-resistant building codes
- Maximize state and local responsibility for resilience

Capability and Capacity Building Activities

Each state may apply for up to \$2M to be used for capability- and capacity-building activities that are directly tied to infrastructure such as:

- Building Code Adoption/Enforcement
- Project Scoping
- Public Awareness and Education
