



State Homeland Security Program

BACKGROUND

The State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) grant application consists of investment justifications (initiatives or projects) that are prioritized based on state, regional, and local public safety stakeholder input. Each year, FEMA releases the grant guidance after the federal budget process is completed (usually in the spring). Virginia issues guidance to stakeholders across the Commonwealth through email announcements, correspondence, and seven regional stakeholder meetings where the grant availability and target capability areas are addressed and discussed. These meetings provide an opportunity for local input through a project proposal submission on all facets of the grant priorities. Project proposals are due at the end of the 60-day period to ensure ample time to develop their requests.

Since 2009, there has been a consistent effort to establish, refine and build upon a risk-based formula to allocate funds from homeland security programs. Each year, the Virginia Department of Emergency Management (VDEM), under the leadership of the governor's office, allocates an average of \$7 million to enhance homeland security and emergency management across the Commonwealth. It is the goal of the governor's office to promote transparency and public safety stakeholder involvement in the decision-making process for the allocation of these critical grant funds. To achieve an objective and transparent decision rationale and to give decision makers confidence that public funds are being well spent; VDEM uses a portfolio decision analysis methodology for grant allocation.

"Federal grants for emergency management and homeland security to Virginia have been cut approximately 70 percent since 2008, requiring us to be more strategic in how money is allocated in order to sustain the basic response capability that has been built up since 9/11," said Dr. Jeff Stern, Virginia's state coordinator for emergency management. "We asked our public safety partners from around the state to determine the priorities for this year's grant process, and nearly 200 local leaders from emergency management, law enforcement, fire and rescue, and EMS participated in the workshop and project evaluation process."

2019 GRANT CYCLE

In April 2019, VDEM hosted a Public Safety Stakeholder Workshop. The purpose of the workshop was to promote the improvement of the SHSP grant allocation process. Outcomes of the workshop included recommendations on grant policies, and stakeholder driven refinement of project proposal scoring criteria. Adopted grant policies include 1) a minimum \$10,000 request, 2) a 10% cap on all funded CERT projects, 3) elimination of the lowest scoring 40% of projects, 4)

State agencies are eligible to partner with local entities but are not eligible to apply on their own, and 5) applicants must include all project components in a single proposal.

Seven non-regional criteria were selected to be evaluated by peer reviewers not within the project region: scope, capability linkage, sustainment, whole of community, project management, performance measurement plan, and project replication. Four regional criteria were selected to be evaluated by subject matter experts: risk, benefit, vetted regionalism, and resource sharing. It was also decided that cyber security and interoperability projects be scored on regional criteria by their respective SMEs. This voluntary process was open to all professional groups, state agencies and local government officials from different disciplines.

2019 RESULTS

Old Dominion University’s Virginia Modeling, Analysis and Simulation Center (VMASC) provided the analysis for the proposals calculating the total benefit score and benefit-cost ratio. In 2019, 126 projects totaling nearly \$13.2 were submitted. Three projects were ineligible, and 2 projects were reprogrammed. The remaining 121 projects costing \$12.6M were evaluated by more than 100 peer reviewers and subject matter experts. Of the 121 projects evaluated, 72 scored above the 40% threshold established by stakeholders. The project’s overall benefit score and cost ratio were used to generate a ranking of all projects. Fifty-four projects valued at \$2.5M were selected for funding (Table 1). Two lower ranking projects were selected for funding to meet a grant law enforcement contribution requirement. Six higher ranking projects were eliminated to achieve the law enforcement requirement. One CERT project was eliminated due to the funding cap.

Projects that did not score high enough to be considered for benefit cost analysis are listed below in order of highest to lowest benefit score (Table 2). This accounts for 49 of 121 projects eligible for review. The minimum benefit score needed to be greater than 48.03.
