Legislative Review – 2022 Session Zoning – Wireless Infrastructure

- SB 255 Zoning; wireless communications infrastructure, application process
- Provides that in its consideration of certain communications infrastructure applications, a locality shall not disapprove an application if
 - (i) the proposed new structure provides additional wireless coverage or capacity for first responders or
 - (ii) the proposed tower is not within a four-mile radius of an existing tower that is part of the applicant's network.

Additional provisions included

Result: Senate Continued to 2023 in Local Govt



Legislative Review – 2022 Session Safe Haven – 9-1-1 Alerting

- HB 50 Safe haven protections; newborn safety device
- Provides an affirmative defense in certain criminal prosecutions and civil proceedings regarding child abuse or neglect to a parent who safely delivers his child within the first 30 days of the child's life to a newborn safety device located at a hospital that provides 24-hour emergency services or at an attended emergency medical services agency that employs emergency medical services personnel.
- Original bill "the device is equipped with a dual alarm system that sounds 60 seconds after a child is placed in the device and automatically places a call to 911 if the alarm is not deactivated within 60 seconds from within the hospital or emergency medical services agency,"
- Substitute removes 9-1-1 reference, replaces w/ 24hr DSS hotline
- Result: Substitute Passed House

Legislation and Harassment of PSAPs

- Several PSAPs have raised the question about existing code languate regarding "unlawful use of telephones".
- There is concern that existing language was crafted in a legacy world and may not address instances of IPcommunication TDOS, DDOS-related attacks or harassing text or video calls in the future.
- Existing language includes inconsistent references to "causes to ring" or "causes to ring or signal".
- There may be a need to review this language to see if it can be cleaned up regarding harassing "callers" to PSAPs – regardless of their means of the "call" arriving at the PSAP.
