NGSB Town Halls August 15-18, 2022

Discussed and received feedback on:

- 9-1-1 and Geospatial Services Bureau move to VDEM and roadmap to complete the successful transition to NGSB
 - Roadmap included short, medium, and long-term recommendations to address culture and behavior, roles and structures, core processes, governance, and compliance
- Update on NG9-1-1 deployment

Feedback

Common themes and discussion points:

- Availability of basic NG9-1-1 information and its benefits (e.g., website onepager, F&Q)
- Desire for training and/or other resources to overcome challenges of adopting new technology and convergence of connectivity
- Need for additional NG9-1-1 outreach to provide status updates and the resources available to localities (e.g., PSAP communication with respective regional coordinators and Regional Advisory Committee)
- Addressing funding questions and concerns with the transition to VDEM (e.g., reoccurring and optimal funding as it relates to consolidation of PSAPs)
- Need for increased coordination among stakeholders and service providers as PSAPs cutover (regional NG9-1-1 project management)






Virginia Next Generation 9-1-1 Deployment Percent Complete and Award Date by PSAP

AT&T tracks status for 19 project items in a Forecasting Spreadsheet. Virginia's 9-1-1 & Geospatial Services Bureau tracks GIS Onboarding Status for Next Generation 9-1-1 at 5 levels with input from Intrado. The percent complete is (number of completed items + GIS status) / 24 possible status levels.



Current map shows contract status






Possible map gives more context to each locality and how they compare




Virginia Percent of ESInet Calls Geospatially Routed

* The number of calls that are ECRF routed is dependant on the Originating Service Provider (OSP) providing the routable location with the originating call. The ESInet attempts to ECRF route the call as the initial choice and if the location isn't available, then the ESInet routes the call based on transitional data. As the OSP's continue to improve location delivery with the call, the number and % of calls that are ECRF routed will increase.






Virginia Next Generation 9-1-1 GIS Onboarding Status at Start of Quarter









NG9-1-1 Project Management Support Decision





Scope

- Phase 1: Project management setup
 Establish processes for ongoing project tracking, identify KPIs, and establish processes for ongoing project progress tracking
- Phase 2: NG9-1-1 expanded project management support to accelerate deployment and provide monitoring

Provide agreed upon project tracking from Phase 1

 Phase 3: Recommendations to enhance ESInet Concurrent with Phase 2, explore specific use cases for additional leveraging of statewide ESInet





FOIA Electronic Meeting Guidance

Guidelines

- Greater flexibility regarding remote meetings
- Remote participation is possible for the following: Personal matters
 A member's medical condition or disability
 - Need to provide medical care for a family member
 - A member's principal residence is 60 miles or more from the meeting location
- Option for all-virtual meetings held outside of states of emergency



Policy on Electronic Participation

- It is the policy of the 9-1-1 Services Board that individual members may participate in meetings by electronic communication as permitted by §2.2-3708.3 of the Code of Virginia
- This policy shall apply to the entire membership and without regard to the identity of the member requesting remote participation or the matters that will be considered or voted on at the meeting
- This policy includes all Committees of the 9-1-1 Services Board



Limitations of Policy

- Whenever an individual member wished to participate remotely, the law requires a quorum of the Board to be physically assembled at the meeting location
- When remote participation is due to a personal matter, such participation is limited to two meetings per calendar year or 25% of the meetings held per calendar year, whichever is greater
- All-virtual public meetings are limited by law to two meetings per calendar year or 25% of the meetings held per calendar year, whichever is greater and may not be consecutive



Process for Requests

- As part of the policy requirements, Board must adopt three processes:
 - One for making requests to use remote participation
 - One for approving or denying such requests One for creating a record of such requests



Requests for Remote Participation

 Requests for remote participation or that the 9-1-1 Services Board conduct an all-virtual public meeting shall be conveyed to the PSC Coordinator who shall then relay such requests to the Board chair



Approving or Denying Requests

- Individual participation from a remote location shall be approved unless such participation would violate this policy or provisions of the Virginia Freedom of Information Act (§2.2-3700 et seq.) of the Code of Virginia
- If a member participates from a remote location is challenged, then the Board shall vote whether to allow such participation



Recording of Requests

- The request for remote participation or that the 9-1-1 Services Board conduct an all-virtual public request shall be recorded in the minutes of the meeting
- If the Boards voted to disapprove of the members participation because such participation would violate this policy, such disapproval shall be recorded in the minutes with specificity
- The minutes shall include other information as required by §§2.2-3707 and 2.2-3708.3 depending on the type of remote participation or all-virtual public meeting

- the state of enhanced 9-1-1 services in the Commonwealth,
- the impact of, or need for, legislation affecting enhanced 9-1-1 services in the Commonwealth,
- the need for changes in the E-911 funding mechanism provided to the Board, as appropriate, and
- monitor developments in enhanced 9-1-1 service and multi-line telephone systems and the impact of such technologies upon the implementation of Article 8 (§ 56-484.19 et seq.) pursuant to subdivision 6.

Geo-Diversity

- Geo-diversity funding for CHE server placement has not been specifically addressed in PSAP Grant Program Guidelines
- This functionality has not been consistently addressed in migration proposals, but has been funded
- PGC concurs with NGSB staff that this should be an allowable NG9-1-1 deployment reimbursable cost

9-1-1 Cost Study

- Distributed a survey to PSAPs to obtain information on specific elements of current operating costs and specific sources of revenue and funding 75 surveys returned (about 63%)
- Moving on to stakeholder interviews Anticipate about 25 to be conducted
- Anticipate study to be completed by late September and Board members briefed at November meeting


